Political Education Chair Message

Friends,

The big news this month was <u>the approval by the British Government of</u> <u>the revised Brexit deal</u> vote - despite Tory rebellion and DUP anger. The <u>Guardian notes</u> that the framework received backing from the majority of MPs, with only the DUP and 22 Conservative rebels – including former PMs Boris Johnson and Liz Truss – voting against it.

DUP leader Jeffrey Donaldson <u>listed five areas of concern</u>, including the harm done to Northern Ireland's union with the rest of the United Kingdom, its place in the UK's internal market, the role of EU law, the workings of a "green lane" for imports from Britain and the "democratic deficit" around the imposition of EU laws. The <u>Orange Order also</u> announced it will not support the agreement unless changed. It noted that the Framework "continues to treat Northern Ireland as a place apart" from the UK.

President Joe Biden is expected to visit to mark the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement next month. Ahead of his visit, Britain has <u>raised</u> the domestic threat level for Northern Ireland to 'severe'. Severe is the second-highest rung on a five-point scale and means an attack is considered highly likely. The threat had stood one notch lower at "substantial" for the past year.

Q. What are the Good Friday Agreements or GFAs?

A. <u>According to Wikipedia, the GFA</u> (signed on 10 April 1998), restored self-government to Northern Ireland on the basis of "power sharing" and it included acceptance of the principle of consent, commitment to civil and political rights, cultural parity of esteem, police reform, paramilitary disarmament and early release of paramilitary prisoners, followed by demilitarization.

Paramilitary groups in Northern Ireland laid down their arms after the 1998 Good Friday peace accord largely ended three decades of violent conflict between Irish republican and British loyalist groups and U.K. security forces that killed more than 3,600 people. But small Irish Republican Army splinter groups have continued to launch sporadic attacks on security forces.
