Political Education Chair Message

President Biden's 5-day visit to Ireland and Northern Ireland to celebrate the anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement was the biggest development this past month. His visit came after UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak achieved passage of the Windsor Framework, a revised deal for Northern Ireland's post-Brexit trading arrangements, in the British Parliament. Its passage was viewed as a face-saving way for the parties in Northern Ireland to form a functional government after the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP) refused to form a power-sharing government in February 2022, in protest over post-Brexit trading arrangements.

Unfortunately, [the UK Independence Party \(UKIP\)](#), and more importantly, the DUP said the revised Framework was [insufficient and did not address key concerns](#). And the standoff continues.

Where do things stand today? Pressure continues to mount for the DUP to join the executive:

Taoiseach (Prime Minister) Leo Varadkar, Tánaiste (Deputy Prime Minister) Micheál Martin, and Sinn Féin party leader Mary Lou McDonald all call for Northern Ireland Executive to be restored this past week: see article "[Varadkar, McDonald and Martin call for Northern Ireland Executive to be restored](#)".

The pressure for the DUP to join the executive in Stormont came from a number of political leaders including the original GFA negotiators [George Mitchell and Gerry Adams](#), [Bill Clinton](#), who says it can be done easily, but sometimes it is easier to say no, as well as [Tony Blair](#), and [Rishi Sunak](#) himself. Rishi stated that if the DUP does not seize the initiative that the framework provides, they are likely to foster [more interest in a united Ireland](#).

On another important front, families of victims of the Troubles have [continued their protest against proposed legislation to deal with legacy issues in Northern Ireland](#). The protest on Monday (23-Apr) coincided with the Bill's next reading in the House of Lords in the UK, and despite the debate being rescheduled the protest went ahead. The Troubles (Legacy and Reconciliation) Bill would provide amnesty for those who committed crimes during the Troubles if they co-operated with a new truth-recovery body.
