Legacy & PEC

In an article entitled, "British government must work with all families on agreed way forward for legacy". Sinn Féin MP Dáire Hughes told the British Secretary of State Hilary Benn on Thursday at the Joint Committee on the Implementation of the Good Friday Agreement that the ICRIR does not have the confidence of the majority of families here. The Newry and Armagh MP said, "The majority of families have been abundantly clear that the ICRIR does not command their confidence, and at yesterday's committee I made that exact point to British Secretary of State Hilary Benn. "This is a result of a number of flaws with the body, not least the question around its impartiality and the role of the British Secretary of State".

And finally, according to Reuters, the British government plans to further appeal a Belfast court ruling

that legislation introduced by the previous government was incompatible with human-rights protections

secured in a post-Brexit agreement for Northern Ireland.

Martin Sheridan, Ireland's Greatest Olympian



As a nation, Paris 2024 was by far Ireland's most successful Olympics, with Irish athletes winning seven medals, including four golds and three bronzes in four different sports: gymnastics, rowing, swimming, and boxing. However, this achievement pales compared to the accomplishments of one early and often overlooked Irish athlete, Martin Sheridan.

Sheridan was born on a small farm in rural Bohola, County Mayo, in 1881. As a young man, he moved to New York seeking better opportunities, and, like many young Irish men, the 6'3 Sheridan joined the New York City police department. As an athlete, he became a member of the Irish American Athletic Club (IAAC) and the renowned "Irish Whales," a group of Irish-born and Irish American athletes known for their immense size and strength who dominated early Olympic throwing competitions.

As an Olympian, Sheridan's talent was unmatched. Competing in the 1904, 1906 (unofficial Intercalated Games), and 1908 Olympics for the United States (Ireland was not an independent country then), he amassed five gold and three silver medals. His primary events included the discus, shot put, and standing jumps. Sheridan's style and technical ability in the discus, in particular, set him apart, and his athletic prowess drew large audiences and media attention, especially from Irish-American communities.

Despite representing the United States, Sheridan's pride in his Irish heritage was well known. At the London 1908 Olympics, after US flag bearer Ralph Rose refused to dip the flag to King Edward VII, Sheridan supposedly gave then now legendary quote (referring to the Stars and Strips), "This flag dips to no earthly king,"

Financial Secretary Notes November 2024

Over the last two years I've been writing monthly notes about topics related to the Financial Secretary (FS) role. If you've read my notes, you understand that there are a lot things that can be involved. This month, I'd like to discuss what I consider the three basic functions (Shepherding Applications, Issuing Keycards, & ttracking dues payments) and the single key responsibility of the FS:

Major Functions

Shepherding Applications: Applications come into the division either by email, or by paper. Once an application comes in the applicant needs to be contacted to determine if the proper application (regular or associate) has been filled out, and the applicant gets vetted. The application fee needs to be paid, the applicants name gets read at the next meeting, and then applicants are invited to be initiated. The vetting process can be shared with the Standing Committee or other volunteers. Issuing Keycards: The actual process of activating, assigning, and when necessary is simple (admittedly the computer sometimes is temperamental). Tracking Dues Payments: When members pay their annual dues, the payments are deposited into the bank (a photo of the deposit slip gets sent to the treasurer), the payment also gets recorded in a ledger (a simple notebook) and into a spreadsheet which includes each member's name, member info, and contact information. That spreadsheet totals the membership numbers (paid & member) unpaid) and those numbers are presented at the monthly meetings. When a new member joins, that

Kev Responsibility

The key responsibility of the Financial Secretary is to report the membership numbers to Division and to provide a list of the paid and unpaid members on a monthly basis to the Club Steward and the Club Rental agent. The three functions listed above could be split between two or even three people.

information is added to the spreadsheet and entered to the AOH National on-line system. AOH National issues travel cards in early February based on the Year-End

roster and the Financial Secretary mails them out to paid members.

Closing Notes

- 1) I have done what I can to promote new membership, but I also hold the position of "Organizer", AND as I've stated in these notes many times, that's every member's job.
- 2) I've written these monthly notes for the bulletin, but that has always been my choice. I think it is

useful, but it isn't a requirement of the position.


