Political Education

The 2025 Program For Government – Securing Ireland's Future has been compiled with the endorsement of the current majority coalition of FG / FF and a collection of 'Independents'. Very clearly, the objective of 32 Counties does not exist. A read-through shows it contains general and generic political language of improving the quality of life of Ireland. SF Leaders have indicated their intent to hold the majority coalition accountable for minimizing such a significant generational objective. Hopefully this will translate in the next election cycle to another eruption of surprise SF victories.

John Finucane SF MP has successfully toured the American northeast (including the NYC Bar Association) promoting the idea of Referendum and of public acknowledgement through Inquiries of British endorsed sectarian killings, specifically his fathers. These audiences were largely Diaspora, attorneys, judges and sympathizers.

In early Feb, a Belfast Coroner's Court ruled that the SMU killing of several Tyrone youths at St Patrick's Church (Clonoe) in 1992 was Unjustified. They each died legally around 11.50PM on Feb16th at the Church. The wounds were head, trunk and chest shots. Statements made at the time of 'a fire fight' and 'an exchange of fire' were demonstrated untrue. Each lad received shots while lying on the ground the report revealed. The operation was neither planned nor controlled. The families involved have been at it for decades seeking public acknowledgment.

It has been announced that *Fleadh Cheoil* will take place in Belfast in 2026. A whole week of Gaelic festival activities. To think in the past this would have been met with mass violence. Though this is unrelated to making Gaelic language legal and acknowledged in any sense. This obviously represents a **reemergence** of Gaelic culture. I used the word reemergence specifically and deliberately. For anyone going to Belfast next year, this might be a good time to go.

For those that have not yet heard - Republican legend Óglach Brendan 'Bik' McFarlane has passed. He was properly laid to rest on Feb27th under a Tricolor flag at Milltown cemetery. The weather was fair. He gave his adult life to the objective of 32 Counties and was well known. He was not raised a republican but later became one. *Requiem Aeternam*

The current phase of 32 Counties is of course different then the pre-Good Friday Era. I will be incorporating the economic and business-related factors of our objective. To be clear, an All-Ireland Economy means transitioning from a Northern Ireland-British Market to a Northern Ireland-Republic of Ireland Market. This has never been a factor before but definitely is now. It may prove to be the ultimate determiner of success.

At Good Friday Agreement cross border trade was $\notin 2B$. It has reached $\notin 10B$ to $\notin 15B$ depending on metrics. (DBEC) Dublin Belfast Economic Corridor is a collection of business, county councils and two academic interests. It is a visionary project drawing many elements toward this common objective. (DBEC) covers 160 km (100mi) and 2M residents. An All Island Economy is not evenly distributed amongst all counties. It consists almost entirely of the Dublin-Belfast zone. There is much room for growth, but also many obstacles. The Brexit era has caused complications for consumers of British goods in the North. These complications have favored North-South trade. The annual convention in Belfast recently occurred with much consensus going forward.

I recently '*craiced*' open some *Keogh's Crisps* at the Division. These are occasionally, but not regularly available in the US. They are noticeably superior to domestic crisps. *Keogh's* (started 2013) is an example of a Border company that has thrived from cross-border sales. More later on these developments...


