Political Education - May (Bealtaine)

Lá Bealtaine or May Day is the first of the month, opposite Halloween Oíche Shamhna it marks the beginning of the warm part of the year.

Recalling the annual White House Shamrock presentation. This tradition of Shamrock Presentation goes back to 1952 and President Truman. Our own Thomas 'Tip' O'Neil, Daniel Patrick Moynihan and President Reagan started the public reception in the early 1980s. President Trump made the following remarks "I love the Irish...As a lifelong New Yorker no one knows the Irish better than me...very few people can compare...they have a lot of fighters...they love to fight...they have a great attitude...we're going to be doing this three more times a least." A quote of George Washington was recited about Ireland "The friend of my country in my country's most friendless day". RFK was present. House Speaker Mike Johnson was a full participant. On Irish Affairs exclusively, I believe we are well positioned for the next three years.

DUP representatives also met with the US President during St Patrick's Day, which I always find both ironic and interesting. The stated objective is to 'promote Northern Ireland'. They do not wear green and insist on the 'true legacy of Saint Patrick'.

Varadkar FG has been fueling support for Unification. He spoke in Philadelphia recently referring to "the great cause...every generation has its great cause, I believe ours is the cause of uniting our island...the tectonic plates are shifting and in one direction only." To my recollection, there was no such talk during his last years holding office. He now works for Penta, a PR firm and teaches part-time at Harvard Kennedy School Center for Public Leadership.

Chairperson *Ceann Comhairle* Verona Murphy of *Dáil Éireann* survived a No Confidence Vote by opposition parties including SF last month.

MEPs Lynn Boylan and Kathleen Funchion SF recently empathized to the European Parliament to begin preparatory work for Reunification.

As mentioned in April, the 1992 killings of several Irish youths in Tyrone by SAS forces was overturned and ruled 'Not Justified' by a Belfast Coroner's Court. The DUP continues to oppose this ruling and insists that 'history is never rewritten'.

If you take Boston and reverse back to the early 1700s, you would find two story houses and cobbled stoned roads. You would also find a regular presence of British soldiers. They could search your house at will and did so. They could inspect your horse carriage at will and did so. They could search you at will and did so. If convicted of a high crime, once identified they would hang you on the spot. They could detain you on suspicion alone for prolonged periods without charging you with a crime. Your guilt of a crime was not determined by fellow citizens. This was largely the same situation in Northern Ireland in the 1960s, 70s, 80s and 90s. The Boston Irish are uniquely qualified to understand this country's War of Independence.

Every summer I climb the Bunker Hill Monument. I first did so in kindergarten. It was a rite of passage. The Irish were of course present and prominent amongst the Volunteers. I explain to people constantly, particularly from Europe and The Republic that this is where the War of Independence ultimately started. I recommend visiting Bunker Hill this summer. Bring some youths *ógra* with you. *Then have pints at Warren Tavern!*

The current phase of 32 Counties is of course different then the pre-Good Friday Era. I will be incorporating the economic and business-related factors of our objective. To be clear, an All-Ireland Economy means transitioning from a Northern Ireland-British Market to a Northern Ireland-Republic of Ireland Market. This has never been a factor before but definitely is now. It may prove to be the ultimate determiner of success.

At Good Friday Agreement cross border trade was €2B. It has reached €10B to €15B depending on metrics. (DBEC) Dublin Belfast Economic Corridor is a collection of business, county councils and two academic interests. It is a visionary project drawing many elements toward this common objective. (DBEC) covers 160 km (100mi) and 2M residents. An All Island Economy is not evenly distributed amongst all counties. It consists almost entirely of the Dublin-Belfast zone. There is much room for growth, but also many obstacles. The Brexit era has caused complications for consumers of British goods in the North. These complications have favored North-South trade. The annual convention in Belfast recently occurred with much consensus going forward.

I recently 'craiced' open some Keogh's Crisps at the Division. These are occasionally, but not regularly available in the US. They are noticeably superior to domestic crisps. Keogh's (started 2013) is an example of a Border company that has thrived from cross-border sales. More later on these developments...

## Irish History: How an insult from Canada turned Ireland into a Republic By John F. Murphy

April 18th, 2025, marked the 76th anniversary of Ireland's declaration as a Republic. Yet, Ireland's transformation into a Republic was a decades-long quest for true independence, finalized in 1949 when the Republic of Ireland was established, spurred significantly by the actions of Canadian and Commonwealth leaders. The struggle began with the 1916 Easter Rising, which fueled Irish nationalism, followed by the War of Independence (1919-1921). The 1921 Anglo-Irish Treaty established the Irish Free State as a British Commonwealth dominion; the British monarch remained the head of state, ruling through a British-appointed Governor-General, a compromise that frustrated Irish republicans craying complete independence. Under Eamon de Valera's leadership in the 1930s, Ireland dismantled the treaty's restrictions, abolishing the oath of allegiance to the monarch. De Valera used the abdication of Edward VIII as a means to introduce a new Constitution in 1937, which named the state Eire and asserted its sovereignty, replacing the Governor General with an elected President. However, Ireland retained nominal ties to the Commonwealth, with the British monarch remaining symbolically involved in foreign affairs. The push for a republic intensified in 1948, driven by external provocation.

At a 1948 Commonwealth conference in Ottawa, Taoiseach (Prime Minister) John A. Costello faced derogatory treatment from Canadian Prime Minister Louis St. Laurent and Canadian Governor General Lord Alexander. Alexander, of Ulster Protestant stock and a prominent Unionist, allegedly placed loyalist symbols, including a replica of the "Roaring Meg" cannon- a symbol from the Siege of Derry in 1689 - on the dinner table at a banquet to represent Ireland. This was perceived as insensitive, given Ireland's nationalist sentiments, and was further exacerbated by the failure to offer a separate toast to the President of Ireland, as agreed upon. These emblems, alongside St. Laurent's verbal slights questioning Ireland's Commonwealth loyalty, deeply offended Costello.

Outraged by these insults, this led Costello to make the surprise announcement in Ottawa, a decision he reportedly did not discuss with his Government or Civil Servants beforehand, unilaterally declaring Ireland's intent to leave the Commonwealth. On April 18, 1949, the Republic of Ireland Act came into effect, proclaiming the Republic of Ireland a fully independent state, free from any ties to Britain and its Commonwealth.
